Senate Bill 179: Davids's Law

David's Law relates to student harassment, bullying, cyberbullying, injury to or death of a minor; creating a criminal offense. Effective September 1, 2017.

Changes include:

- Definition of bullying changed to
 - single significant act or pattern of acts by one or more students directed at another student that exploits an imbalance of power
 - o Include
 - Is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive enough that the action or threat creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student
 - materially and substantially disrupts the educational process or the orderly operation of a classroom or school
 - Infringes on the rights of the victim at school and
 - Cyberbullying
- Definition of Cyberbullying

Bullying that is done through the use of electronic communication, including through the use of a cellular or other type of telephone, a computer, a pager, a camera, electronic mail, instant messaging, text messaging, a social media application, Internet website, or other Internet-based communication tool.

- Bullying that occurs
 - On or is delivered to school property or to the site of a school-sponsored or school-related activity on or off school property
 - On a publicly or privately owned school bus or van being used for transportation of students to or from school or a school-sponsored or school-related activity
- Cyberbullying that occurs
 - Off school property or outside of a school-sponsored or school-related activity if the cyberbullying
 - o Interferes with a student's educational opportunities
 - Substantially disrupts the orderly operations of a classroom, school, or school-sponsored or school-related activity
- Procedure for providing notice of an incident of bullying to a parent or guardian of the alleged victim on or before the third business day after the date the incident is reported; and to a parent or guardian of the alleged bully within a reasonable amount of time after the incident
- Procedures for a student to anonymously report an incident of bullying
- Additional points. David's Law
 - allows school districts to establish a districtwide policy related to bullying prevention and mediation
 - specifies the placement or expulsion of certain students for certain bullying behavior
 - o specifies reports that school principals may make to local law enforcement

- o allows continuing education requirements for classroom teachers and principals to include instruction related to grief-informed and trauma-informed strategies
- o requires TEA to maintain a website with resources related to student mental health needs
- o amends the Health and Safety Code to expand the list of certain procedures that school districts may develop
- o amends the Civil Practice and Remedies Code to specify relief for cyberbullying of a child, and to require that the Texas Supreme Court promulgate forms for use as an application for injunctive relief in suits relating to cyberbullying
- amends the Penal Code to include certain actions within the offense of harassment
