Before Arriving to School



Screening Process

Daily Health Screenings for Students:

While a daily screening for symptoms should be completed each morning before coming to school, the following protocols will be implemented in addition regarding screening while on campus:

- All individuals should be screened at home before coming into the school for fever, cough, sore throat, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, chills, muscle pain, headache, loss of taste or smell, congestion and runny nose or shortness of breath.
- Parents can utilize symptom checklist provided on our webpage for daily screeners
- Students with a temperature over 100 degrees Fahrenheit will not be permitted to stay in school.
- Identified sick persons will be isolated immediately and a parent or guardian must pick up student within an hour of being notified.
- Parents should not enter the facility unless arranged by an administrator. Students will be escorted outside the building and delivered to a verified adult with a blue car placard.



Student Drop- Off & Traffic Flow

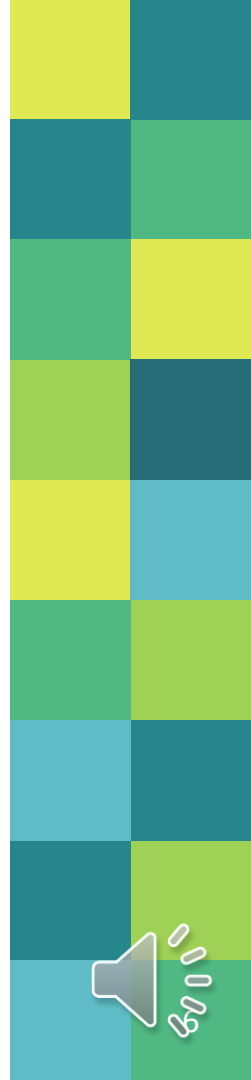
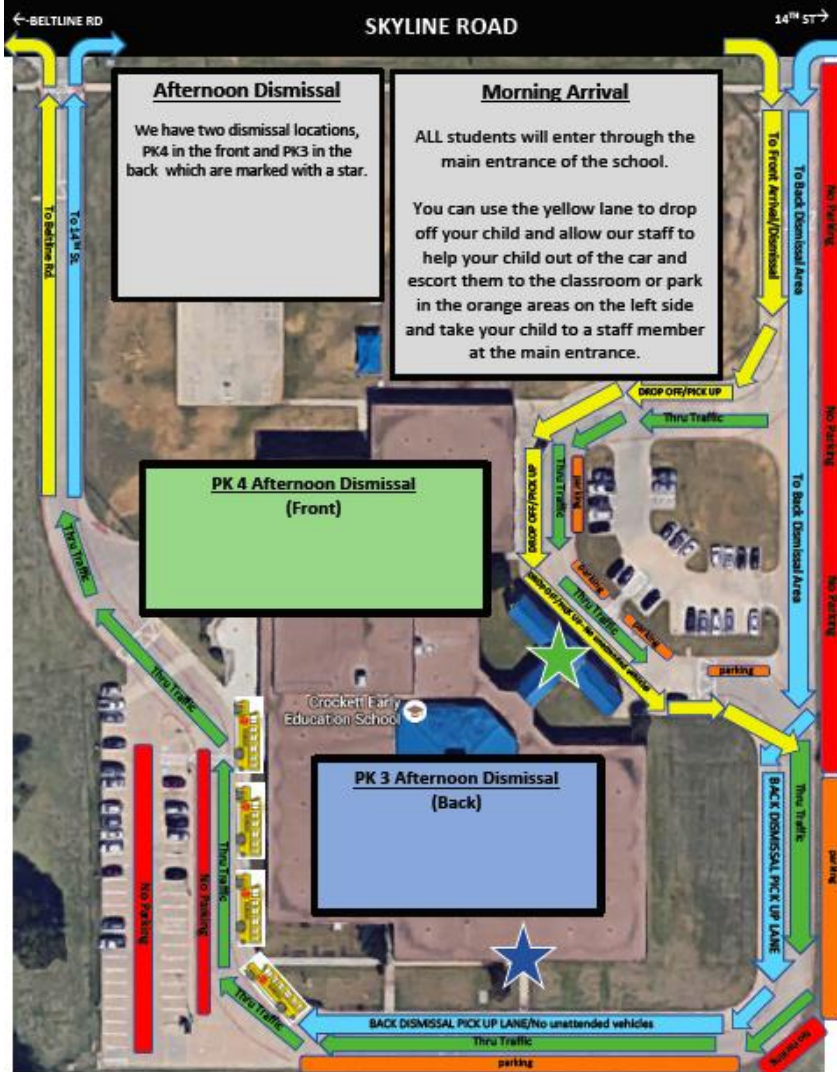


Morning Procedure

- There is one entrance and one exit to our campus. Please follow the flow of traffic and remember if parking, never utilize the right hand side of the curbs.
- Parents will drop off students at the front entrance of the school by following the flow of traffic (see map). Adults will stay in their car in the right hand lane, assist the child with unbuckling their seatbelt, and wait for an employee to open the door and escort your child inside. Doors open ready to receive your children at 7:30am.
- Parents who **MUST** walk students to the door may park on the left hand side curbs. Parents will escort students across the crosswalk to be released to an employee at the front door.
- At this time, parents and families will not be allowed inside of the building to ensure social distancing.

Transportation (PK4 Students Only)

- Before a student can utilize the bus, a signed agreement must be on file (teachers and/or bus monitors will have blank copies for you to sign if needed).
- Please ensure that you are screening your child before allowing them to board the bus.
- We ask that whoever is picking up your child from their bus stop is of age as we will not release students to people under the age of 18.
- Parents must exit their car & present blue car placard to monitor for student to be released.
- After three occasions of students not being picked up at their stop on time, bus privileges will be suspended.
- We encourage all parents to use the SMART Parent Portal. Doing so will provide the parent bus route information associated with their child as well as give them communication 10 minutes before their child's pick up and drop off time.

Attendance & Tardies



Attendance & Tardies

- Please become familiar with the GPISD Attendance Policy found [HERE:](https://www.gpisd.org/Domain/12757) <https://www.gpisd.org/Domain/12757>
- Students who arrive to school before 10am will be counted present, whereas students who arrive after 10am will be counted absent.
- After 10 consecutive absences student will be unenrolled
- When a student is absent, is it essential to call the front office to let us know. Ensure that you send a note with your student to be turned into the front office upon returning to school.
- Please become familiar with Excused vs Unexcused Absences found on the website provided above.
- Our tardy bell rings at 8:10am. Any students who arrive to campus after that time will be counted as tardy.
- Three tardies are then considered as one absence.
- Any student who arrives after the 8:10 tardy bell rings will need to be signed in with the school by an adult. The parent or adult will remain with the student outside in a waiting area until a classroom teacher or school employee can escort them to classroom.



Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)



Personal Protective Equipment

Protective measures, including the use of face coverings, will be determined by the level of disease activity of Covid-The District will rely on data and recommendations from state and local governments as well as the Texas Education Agency.

- District staff members will wear masks when in the presence of students or other staff members. They may also choose to wear a clear shield in addition to the mask. The CDC does not currently recommend the use of face shields as a substitute for a face mask.
- Students in grades PK – 12 will wear masks when in the presence of students or staff members. They may also choose to wear a clear shield in addition to the mask. The CDC does not currently recommend the use of face shields as a substitute for a face mask.
- Staff will be provided gloves and cleaning supplies to clean touchpoint surfaces throughout day as needed.
- Anytime social distancing cannot be maintained masks are required.
- Please note that social distancing will still be practiced even with the use of gloves and masks as much as is possible.



Visitors on Campus



Protocols for Campus Visitors

- Campuses will utilize virtual meeting options to limit campus visitors when possible.
- All visitors who enter the building will be required to wear a face covering. A mask will be provided in the event that a visitor arrives without a mask.
- All visitors who wish to enter the building will be screened prior to access.
- At this time, due to CDC social distancing guidelines, we will not be able to accommodate visitors during lunch.



Early Pick-Up



Early Pick-Up Protocol

- Students should remain on campus for the duration of the day. Early pick-up should only be utilized for ill students or appointments only.
- We ask that all planned early dismissals be communicated to the front office and classroom teacher at least 24 hours in advance if possible.
- Parent will be screened before entering the building.
- Parents who arrive when dismissal process has already begun may be required to wait until a school employee is available to escort child safely.
- Students who leave before 10am will be counted absent for the day.
- Multiple occurrences of early pick-up may result in a meeting with administration to discuss campus expectations.

Dismissal Procedures

- To ensure social distancing, we ask that all students are picked up as car riders and will not be utilizing a 'walk-up' system at this time.
- PreK4 classes will be dismissed from the front part of the building & PreK3 will be dismissed from the back of the building (see map).
- Parents/Guardians MUST present blue car placard for child to be released to them.
- Parents and families will remain in their cars and follow instructions.
- Please be courteous to all employees and families on campus during this process.
- For the safety of all students, personnel, and families on campus, please remember that our campus is considered a school zone therefore utilizing a cell phone while driving is NOT permitted, and school zone speed limits are enforced.
- Any changes in dismissal for the day should be received to the classroom teacher and front office before 2:40pm to be accommodated efficiently (i.e. student will be a car rider instead of a bus rider today, etc.).



Late Pick-Up

- The school day ends at 3:35 p.m.
- Any student not picked up by 3:45 p.m., will be taken to the front office and must be signed out by a parent/guardian with the staff member at the front entrance.
- To ensure the safety of all students, blue car placards must be physically present to sign your child out.



Medication



Medication

- If your student has a medical condition that requires medicine, or has an allergy please notify the clinic staff.
- If your student is not up to date on their immunizations, all parents will receive a notification of delinquency and the student cannot return until he/she meets state PreK requirements.
- If student needs to take medicine during the day, please stop by the clinic to drop off medication, **DO NOT** send medicine in students backpack.
- All medication whether it is over the counter or prescribed must be signed in with the nursing staff.



District Toileting Policy



GPISD Toileting Policy

- The GPISD Toileting Policy has be provided by classroom teachers.
- Students are not allowed to wear diapers or pull-ups to school and must wear underwear.
- Parents should send 3 changes of clothes with their child daily. Two sets will travel back and forth in the students backpack and one set will remain in the classroom. These clothes should be replenished as necessary. No additional clothes are housed on campus to assist a student who does not bring clothes.
- When a student has an accident, two employees will coach the child through an independent clothing change.
- Parents or legal guardians may be asked to come and assist with changing their child if necessary, for their child's comfort.
- Parents will be notified and expected to pick up their student for a more thorough cleaning should they have more then 2 urine or 1 bowel accidents during the school day. Your child may return to school to complete the rest of the day once that has been completed.



Lunch



Visitors, Cost, Payment & Menus

- At this time, due to CDC social distancing guidelines, we will not be able to accommodate visitors during lunch.
- If you feel that your child may be eligible for free or reduced lunch, eligibility is determined by filling out the free and reduced-price meal application. That application is found in Skyward or you can click the link provided to access it directly www.gpisd.org/MealApplication.

Delinquent Lunch Accounts

Families who wish to apply for free or reduced price meals must complete an application each year. Families may apply at any time.

Parents/legal guardians pay for all of their child(ren)'s meals not otherwise provided by the National School Lunch Program.

- A student, other than those qualifying for reduced price meals, who has five unpaid meals charged to their account, will be provided an alternate meal.
- Students who qualify for reduced price meals will be provided an alternate meal after (10) unpaid meals.
- The student will not be allowed to exchange an item in the alternate meal.
- The student will not be permitted to charge or purchase supplemental items (a la carte or snack items) such as milk, ice cream, potato chips, etc.
- These restrictions will remain until the account balance has been paid in full.
- Parents will be notified by phone, email, letter, and/or text when a student meal account is negative.

Student Birthdays During COVID-19

- We understand that birthdays are special occasions for young children.
- For the safety of all students, parents will not be allowed to celebrate birthdays in the classroom, bring cakes, cupcakes, favors, etc. and/or provide these items to share with the class during this time.
- We strongly discourage the delivery of gifts such as flowers, balloons, etc. to school. We will not be able to deliver them to the classroom and they are not allowed on the bus.

Parent Teacher Conferences

- Two dates have been allocated as Parent Teacher Conference Days and will be scheduled by your classroom teacher as the dates arrive. These conferences will take place on Friday, November 6, 2020 & Monday, March 15, 2021.
- In addition to those allocated dates, parents are welcome to schedule a meeting with your child's teacher at any time throughout the year.



GPISD School Safety Plan Protocols



Students Displaying COVID-19 Symptoms on Campus

When a student has displayed symptoms of COVID-19, the student will be moved to an isolation room, where the school nurse will provide a clinical assessment to determine if it is necessary to send the child home.

- Students who are ill should be picked up within 30 minutes and no later than 1 hour from the time the campus contacted the student's parent/guardian.
- If the nurse determines that the child should be sent home, other students will be removed from the classroom and taken to an alternate location on campus, and the room will not be accessed until disinfecting is complete.
- Staff members displaying COVID-19 symptoms will follow district protocols including isolation from students and other staff members.
- It is imperative that you maintain updated emergency contact information and let the office know of any changes that happen.



Students Displaying COVID-19 Symptoms Returning to Campus

Any individuals who either: (a) are lab-confirmed to have COVID-19; or (b) experience the symptoms of COVID-19 must stay at home throughout the infection period, and cannot return to campus until the conditions listed below for campus re-entry have been met:

In the case of an individual who was diagnosed with COVID-19, the individual may return to school when all three of the following criteria are met:

- at least one day (24 hours) have passed since recovery (resolution of fever without the use of fever reducing medications);
- the individual has improvement in symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath); **and**
- at least ten days have passed since symptoms first appeared.
