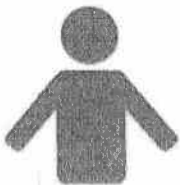
## SPRING 2020 TSI Assessment (TSIA)

### *What is the TSIA?*

The TSI Assessment (TSIA) is part of the Texas Success Initiative program designed to help colleges and universities determine if students are ready for college-level course work in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics. With HB3/CCMR college ready and career ready criteria requiring students to be TSI met prior to high school graduation, it is important for teachers to know the TSIA and how to prepare students for taking it.

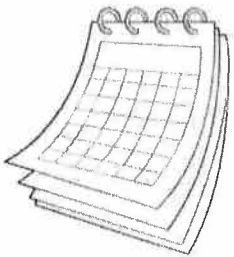
### WHO SHOULD ATTEND:
