The University of Texas at Austin's OnRamps dual-enrollment program provides opportunities for high school students to earn college credit. OnRamps is designed to accelerate student success by providing university-level work and develops skills necessary for college.

Why OnRamps?

Students are exempt from TSI requirements for OnRamps courses |

OnRamps courses transfer to public colleges and universities in Texas and beyond | › Cost Effective
UT core courses at 75% off the cost for the same course taken on campus |

How does OnRamps work?

Students are enrolled in a yearlong university-level learning experience taught by a UT-trained high school teacher on your high school campus. Students experience curriculum designed by faculty at The University of Texas at Austin. Students can earn three hours of UT credit, with feedback and assessment provided by UT course staff,
